Humpbacks are mammals. Among the one million species or families in the world, the humpback whale is one of the largest. While animals have been divided into six classes such as birds, reptiles and fish, the most complex are the mammals. Belonging to the mammals, the humpback is one of a related group of ten species called the baleen or great whales because they are the largest marine animals in the world. Absolutely the largest of the great whales are the blues which stretch to thirty meters and weight 140 tons. The humpback is the fourth largest species, the size of three elephants but only half the length and one third the weight of the blue whale. Humpbacks are huge animals.
